

<b>The Assessment Pathway</b>	
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are resident in the Wakefield district or have a local connection to the Wakefield district and have an identified support need which impacts on their ability to maintain accommodation.</li> <li>• Aged 16 or over.</li> <li>• Are assessed as scoring 3 or 4 in Housing section and 3 or 4 in at least three other sections of the Assessment Pathway access form</li> <li>• Have recourse to public funds such as Universal Credit (or Housing Benefit where relevant).</li> </ul>
Summary description of service	<p>The pathway is for single adults who are at immediate risk of homelessness. The Pathway creates an opportunity to identify and understand a person's support needs and identify the most appropriate support for them. The service will support people to overcome barriers to gaining a tenancy.</p> <p>The Pathway includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assessment Centre, providing brief outcome-focussed interventions within an 8 week period to support people to address an immediate housing need, identify barriers to their getting a longer-term tenancy either in social housing or the private rented sector and address these through support planning.</li> <li>• Short term supported housing for people whose barriers to getting a longer-term tenancy cannot be addressed through the brief intervention work of the Assessment Centre and need support over a longer period in order to be able to successful move on to either social housing or a private rented tenancy.</li> </ul>
Capacity	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 12 unit Assessment Centre with an average of 14 hours support per week</li> <li>• 36 units of short term supported housing with an average of 7 hours support per week</li> </ul>

<b>The Access to Housing Pathway</b>	
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are resident in the Wakefield district or have a local connection to the Wakefield district and have an identified support need which impacts on their ability to maintain accommodation.</li> <li>• Are in need of suitable accommodation</li> <li>• Are aged 18 or over</li> <li>• Have recourse to public funds such as Universal Credit (or Housing Benefit where relevant).</li> </ul>
Summary description of service	<p>The Pathway supports access to a range of housing options for people facing homelessness in the district. The Pathway will support and enable people to plan for and achieve the best, realistic, housing solution for them, including through promoting the use of the private rented sector as a viable housing option.</p> <p>Once the service user has been supported to move into suitable accommodation, housing related support will continue to be made available to them. The Pathway will focus on helping service users to gain the skills they need to live independently, develop resilience and to respond to and deal with issues around their housing themselves. Support will be time-limited and outcome focussed. Support will end without this putting the person's tenancy at risk and without the need for the person to move.</p>
Capacity	Average of 4 hours of housing related support per household per week to 175 single people and couples and 20 families at any one time

<b>The Housing Sustainment Pathway ('Sustain Wakefield')</b>	
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are resident in the Wakefield district or have a local connection to the Wakefield district and have an identified support need which impacts on their ability to maintain accommodation.</li> <li>• Are currently in accommodation or are due to move into identified suitable housing.</li> <li>• Are aged 16 or over</li> <li>• Have recourse to public funds such as Universal Credit (or Housing Benefit where relevant).</li> </ul>
Summary description of service	<p>The Pathway will help people sustain their accommodation and will prevent homelessness.</p> <p>The Pathway will focus on helping service users to gain the skills they need to live independently, develop resilience and to respond to and deal with issues around their housing themselves. Support will be time-limited and outcome focussed.</p>
Capacity	Average of 2.5 hours of housing related support per household per week to 175 single people and couples and 60 families at any one time.

<b>Young Families Service</b>	
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are resident in the Wakefield district or have a local connection to the Wakefield district and have an identified support need which impacts on their ability to maintain accommodation.</li> <li>• Are aged between 16 and 25 and are, or are about to become, parents.</li> <li>• Have recourse to public funds such as Universal Credit (or Housing Benefit where relevant).</li> </ul>
Summary description of service	<p>The service will improve the life chances of young parents and enhance the relationships between the parents and their children</p> <p>The service will promote young parents independent living</p>

	skills and increase their ability to manage and maintain a tenancy
Capacity	4 units of accommodation for teenage mothers and a floating support service for 32 young families (including mothers and fathers).

<b>Woodside and Woodview</b>	
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are resident in the Wakefield district or have a local connection to the Wakefield district and have an identified support need which impacts on their ability to maintain accommodation.</li> <li>• Aged 18 or over</li> <li>• Have a need related to their mental health</li> <li>• Have recourse to public funds such as Universal Credit (or Housing Benefit where relevant).</li> </ul>
Summary description of service	<p>Recovery focussed short-term supported accommodation for adults with mental health needs.</p> <p>The service will promote recovery and support people to build confidence and resilience, improve independent living skills and increase their ability to manage and maintain a tenancy</p>
Capacity	12 units of accommodation with an average of 10 hours support per week

How to refer	<p>Only professionals can complete a referral into the Single Point of Access. A Wakefield Housing Related Support Pathways Referral is required for this pathway.</p> <p>Individuals should contact the provider to be referred or the Single Point of Access directly.</p>

<b>Spring Hill Close</b>	
Eligibility	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Are resident in Wakefield or have a local connection to the Wakefield District</li> <li>• Are aged 16 or over (although there will be no more than two 16-17 years old in the service at any one time)</li> <li>• Are assessed as scoring 2 or above in the housing section and 3 or 4 in at least 4 other sections of the Spring Hill Close Access Form</li> <li>• It can be evidenced would benefit from the longer term, intensive support available at the Complex Needs Service (for example referral information shows they have abandoned, been excluded from or struggled to achieve outcomes in other services or temporary accommodation, or that due to levels of need the Assessment Pathway is unlikely to be able to achieve positive outcomes within contracted timescales)</li> <li>• Have recourse to public funds such as Universal Credit (or Housing Benefit)</li> </ul>
Summary description of service	<p>Supported accommodation adults with multiple and complex needs.</p> <p>The service will focus on harm reduction, recovery and resilience to support people to move on to independent living.</p> <p>Approaches to support will be flexible and new ways of working will be tried in order to support people who may have struggled to engage with, and achieve positive outcomes in, other services.</p>
Capacity	4 one-bed flats and 4 bedsits with an average 14 hours support per week
