

**Local Development Framework
City of Wakefield Metropolitan District Council
Waste Development Plan Document Adoption Statement
14 January 2010**

This Adoption Statement has been prepared in accordance with Regulation 24(2) and Regulation 36 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004 and the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2008 and gives notice that the City of Wakefield Metropolitan District Council resolved to formally adopt the Waste Development Plan Document on the 9 December 2009.

The Waste Development Plan Document forms part of the City of Wakefield Metropolitan District Council Local Development Framework. The Waste Development Plan Document develops the spatial vision, objectives and overall strategy set out in the Core Strategy (the main overarching document of the Local Development Framework) into more detailed policies and proposals relating directly to the management of waste generated in the district. The document provides the policy framework for delivering waste management for the period to 2026.

Elizabeth Hill, an Independent Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, examined the Waste Development Plan Document during 2009. As part of this examination process, hearings were held between 28th and 29th July 2009. The Inspector's Report, with its recommendations, was published on 12 October 2009. The adopted Waste Development Plan Document contains the Inspector's recommendations that are binding on the Council.

Any person aggrieved by the Waste Development Plan Document may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act (2004). Any challenge must be made on the grounds that either the document has not been prepared within the powers conferred by Part 2 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 or that a requirement of the Act or associated Regulations has not been complied with. Any such application must be made promptly and in any event no later than 6 weeks after the date of this notice (i.e. by **24 February 2010**).

The adopted Waste Development Plan Document, Inspector's Report, this Adoption Statement, the Sustainability Appraisal Report and the Sustainability Appraisal Post-adoption Statement (prepared in accordance with the Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004 (16) (3) and (4)) are available for public inspection on the Council's website (www.wakefield.gov.uk/ldf) and at the following locations:
