This guide provides information on the admission of children to primary schools in the Wakefield Metropolitan District. I hope that you will find it informative and useful.

Please take the time to read this guide carefully: it contains details of our own admissions policies and procedures and the rules we, and schools, must follow.

Reading this "Guide for Parents" now may prevent misunderstanding and disappointment later. If, having read this booklet, you need more information, please contact the School Admissions Team in Family Services at County Hall, Wakefield. Staff will do all they can to help you.

Starting a new school can be a worrying time for both parents and children. We aim to make the school admissions process as painless and trouble-free as we can.

We are proud of the achievements of the district's schools in educating young people and promoting skills, enterprise and work. In 2010, 84% of the young people in our schools achieved 5 or more GCSEs, grades A* to C, a performance ranking in the top ten for the whole country.

Furthermore, over half (56%) of the young people achieved the higher level of 5 or more good GCSEs, including English and Maths.

All of us in Family Services want your child to be happy and successful throughout their time at school. I do hope that will prove to be the case, and that your child will take full advantage, not just of the high standard of teaching our schools offer, but also of the full range of extra curricular activities available in schools.

Introduction

All children born between 1 September 2007 and 31 August 2008 are due to start full time education at an infant/primary school from September 2012. Children in year 2 of an infant school will also be due to move to a junior school.

All parents/carers need to apply for a primary or junior school place for their child.

You still need to apply to Wakefield even if your choice of school/s is within another Council.

You can apply for your child's school place:

- Online; or
- Using the application form supplied by the Admissions Team.

Where possible we suggest that you apply online. Many parents and carers find it easier and quicker to do this.

To do this please visit:

www.wakefield.gov.uk/admissiontoschool

- There are clear, simple prompts to help you make your application
- You will get an email confirmation that your application has been received
- The system helps you by checking for errors
- There is no risk that your application will be lost in the post
- You can change the details on your application right up until the closing date
- The system will securely store your information
- Your school offer will be available online at midnight on 11 April 2012 instead of having to wait for the post

Remember to help you fill your form in and to find out about the application process please make sure you read this guide.

Section 1

How to Complete Your Application Form

Some parents try to get the school of their choice by giving false information.

Wakefield Council has the right to challenge the information on your form. We will contact schools, other council departments, other admissions authorities and the health authority to check if the information given is right. You may also be asked to provide evidence.

Supplying false information may result in a school place being withdrawn.

All parents are asked to accept offers of a place by 9 May 2012.

Please note that there is no guarantee that you will get a place at a school of your choice.

You need to fill in all the personal details asked for in sections (A) and (B).

(A) Child's Details

• Address at which your child is normally resident.

This is the child's permanent address. This is where he or she lives with a person with parental responsibility or with a parent (as defined in Section 576 of the Education Act 1996)

- Where there is split custody, please use the address where the child lives for most of the school week. (For example: If a child lives with mother Monday -Thursday and father Friday - Sunday, the mother's address would be used)
- If custody is split equally between mother and father, wherever possible we will try to allocate a place at a school that is accessible from both addresses. However, both parents must agree as to which schools they choose
- If your child's address changes, or is due to change before the autumn 2012 school term, you must notify the School Admissions Team immediately.

(B) Parent's or Carer's Details

- Give your title, first name and surname
- You need only give your address if it is different to your child's
- Give your contact details
- Tell us what relationship the child is to you and confirm whether you have parental responsibility

(C) Children in Care and Special Educational Needs

Only tick these boxes if your child is:

- Subject to a care order or interim care order

- Accommodated by a Local Authority in a full-time placement

- Has a Statement of Special Educational Needs

(D) Preferences

This is where you can choose up to three schools within the Wakefield district or any other authority.

- Put the names of the schools in preference order – the school you most want in box 1, the second in box 2 and third in box 3
Please complete one application per child. If you wish to amend your application you can do so. We will use the latest dated application form we have
- Do not put the same school twice - this will not increase your chance of getting a place at that school
- You may give reasons for your choices in the box provided
- Please tell us of any older brothers or sisters at any of the schools you have chosen. Please do not include them if they will have left the school by September 2012.

Please note:

- Each school has a 'catchment area'. Your catchment area is stated in your letter
- If your child is not offered a place at one of your three choices, a place will be allocated at the next closest school to your address that has places available
- Attendance at a nursery unit or pre-5 class at a school does not guarantee a place in the same school, similarly attendance at an Infant School does not guarantee a place at the link junior school. (Voluntary Aided Schools excluded)
- Late applications may affect your offer of a school place
So you know that we have got your application, we will confirm in writing within four weeks of receiving it. It is your responsibility to contact the School Admissions Team if you do not receive this letter.

(E) Declaration

- You must sign the declaration

The closing date for all applications is 15 January 2012.

Offers of places will be posted out on the 11 April 2012. If you applied online you can find out from midnight on this day.

Section 2

Nursery and Pre-School Education

Information about Early Years Provision for 3 and 4 year olds

This section explains what is currently available for children aged from three to five. Parents have a choice where their child accesses the Free Early Years Entitlement. This can be taken at a maximum of two providers. However, all children are legally required to start full time school the term after their fifth birthday. Wakefield Council has responsibility for all admissions to school.

Early Years Foundation Stage

The Early Year's Foundation Stage is the framework for learning, development and care for children from birth to five. The practitioners working with your child will identify their interests and abilities and aim to build on these through play. Meeting the individual needs of all children is an intrinsic part of the Early Years Foundation Stage. Early Years practitioners should deliver personalised learning, development and care to help children to get the best possible start in life. This should also give you confidence in leaving your child with a nursery, playgroup or childminder knowing that they are happy, safe and well cared for. All early years practitioners must follow the guidelines set out in the framework.

Early Years Provision in Wakefield.

A child can access a free part-time nursery place from the term after their third birthday. Children can access up to 15 hours per week of free early years provision for 38 weeks of the year. See 'Flexibility' towards the end of this section for further details about how the free entitlement can be accessed.

Free nursery places are only available through a provider or setting that is part of the Wakefield Directory of Providers. Always check that the setting you choose offers Free Early Years Provision and the number of hours that can be taken up in that setting each day.

Within Wakefield there are the following providers:

- Three Nursery Schools
- Nursery and Foundation Units in most infant and primary schools
- Private day nurseries
- Pre-school playgroups
- Council day nurseries

- Independent schools
- Childminders who are part of an accredited network

Some settings also offer extra childcare outside of the hours of free daily entitlement. There will be an additional charge to use these. A list of nurseries and schools can be found in Appendix 1. Parents who need a flexible place may be able to access one where there is sufficient demand or flexibility in the area. See 'Flexibility and Wraparound Care' towards the end of this section for further information.

Starting nursery

The earliest date a child can start a free nursery place is the term after the child's 3rd birthday. Although a free part-time nursery place for each child whose parents want one is guaranteed, this place may not be at the school of your preferred choice or within the area you live. Nurseries often have a waiting list for places.

Date of Birth	Term in which 3rd birthday Falls	1st term of eligibility following 3rd birthday
1 January - 31 March	Spring	Summer (after Easter)
1 April - 31 August	Summer	Autumn (September)
1 September - 31 Dec	Autumn	Spring (January)

How nursery places are allocated.

Each setting, school, private nursery or independent provider is responsible for allocating their own nursery places. You will need to contact them to find out how to apply for a place.

School nursery places

Where a school receives more applications than places available then children should be admitted in the following order:

1. Children under special educational needs statutory assessment or with a statement of special educational needs (which names the school);
2. Children in public care (Looked After Children);
3. Children who live in the school's catchment area or parish area, who have brothers or sisters attending the school at the time of admission;
4. Other children who live in the school's catchment area;
5. Children who live outside the school's catchment area but have brothers or sisters in attendance at the school;
6. Other children by age order (admitting eldest first).

Brothers and sisters are defined as children with brothers or sisters (including step-brothers or sisters) living at the same address, in attendance at the same school or a school on the same site, on the date of admission.

Where any criterion category is over-subscribed then children within that category should be admitted in an age order basis (eldest first).

All voluntary aided, foundation (trust) schools and academies should admit part-time children following their own full-time admissions criteria as in the published Primary Guide for Parents.

Children from families living outside the Wakefield district will be considered alongside those who live in the district.

The school/provider will be able to tell you when and if a place is likely to become available.

To register your interest in a place you should put your child's name on a waiting list once they reach two years old. You may want to choose more than one setting, just in case your first choice doesn't have places.

For nurseries within schools there is an agreement that they will let parents know at least six weeks before the term your child would be due to start.

This should give you time to make other arrangements if your child does not get a place.

A place in a school nursery class does not guarantee a full-time place at that school. Parents of children in nursery units must complete an Admission Preference Form, in order to request a full-time place in a school, because the admissions criteria has to be applied afresh to determine which school has places. Schools should not put pressure on parents for their child to attend nursery, in order to gain a place at the school.

How to choose the best setting for your child

Every child and parent's needs are different therefore it is recommended that you visit and spend some time with each prospective setting to see which you like best and to discuss your child's needs.

Flexibility

Where available the free provision can be taken up flexibly over a minimum of three days a week. A maximum of 10 hours and a minimum of 3 hours can be claimed in one day, although this is usually available and offered by private day nurseries and local authority day nurseries. The majority of school nursery classes offer 3 hour long morning or afternoon sessions, although some schools are offering the free entitlement flexibly. You will need to ask the school if they are offering the free entitlement flexibly. If you require further information about the flexible offer, please contact the Childcare and Market Development Programme on 01924 305630.

Wraparound care

Wraparound care is childcare which wraps around the free part-time place. For example, if you would like your child to attend for more than 15 hours and they attend for 5 mornings, and you would like them to attend for a full day then you would pay for the lunchtime and afternoon session.

The list of schools at the back of this guide gives you an idea of what each school can offer. This can change, so please check with the school or the Wakefield Families Information Service.

Before and after school childcare

Some schools offer care and play opportunities for children aged 3 to 11 years. The type of care offered includes breakfast clubs, which are open before school around 8.00 am, after school clubs, open until 5.30 pm or 6.00 pm and holiday care during half-term and main school holidays. You will have to pay to use these. Please check with the school to find out what they offer.

Children's Centres

Children Centres offer access to a range of support for all families with children 0-5 years. Services support families to give children the best start in life and help them to reach their potential. They offer a range of services;

- Support for parents – including advice on parenting, local childcare options and access to specialist services for families
- Child and family health services – ranging from health visitor and health screening services to breastfeeding support
- Helping parents into work – with links to Jobcentre Plus and training
- Integrated childcare and early years education either on site or through linked providers.

Section 3

How to apply for your child's first and junior school place

We have tried to make the admissions and application process as fair and easy as possible.

We have done this by:

- Allowing parents/carers to choose up to three schools in preference order on one application form
- By fairly allocating places so that as many children as possible can get a place at a school of their choice
- By having one day, 11 April 2012, on which all offers of a school place will be posted out

This section tells you how to apply for:

- Your child's first place at school
- Your child a place at a junior or primary school when leaving year 2 or an infant school

It is your responsibility to apply for a place. You should not assume that we know your child needs a school place, even if you have put your child's name on a waiting list or you have an older child at the school.

You still need to apply for a place even if your child is currently in the infant or nursery of the school you want them to go to.

If you do not apply we will not be able to offer your child a school place.

To help you understand the process we have included some frequently asked questions.

Frequently Asked Questions

Applying for your child's first school place

When should my child start full time school?

All reception age children will start school in September 2012.

The first year of school is known as reception year.

If your child is in year 2 of infant school you need to apply for your child a place at either a junior or year 3 of a primary school.

If your child currently goes to a primary school you do not need to apply for a school place in the junior years as your child will continue with their education at the same school.

If my child attends an infant school, does this mean they will automatically attend the feeder junior school?

No. This does not automatically mean your child will get a place at the junior school. We do not operate a feeder system. We cannot guarantee places at any school.

What types of schools are there?

You can apply for any school that covers the age group for your child. However you are not guaranteed a place. All applications have to meet the schools and Council's admissions policies. These are explained in this section and section 8.

These are the following types of schools:

- **Community Schools** - These are schools maintained and controlled by Wakefield Council. The majority of schools in the district are Community Schools. Wakefield Council is responsible for all admissions to Community Schools

- **Voluntary Schools** - Some schools are owned by a voluntary body. Usually it is a church such as Church of England or Roman Catholic Church. This is not always the case. The Governing Body of a Voluntary School has the majority of its governors appointed by the church authority or foundation that provides the school. They would, for example, seek to preserve any religious associations which the school has.

There are two types of Voluntary School:

Voluntary Aided Schools are responsible for all their own admissions arrangements. Decisions on admission to the school are made by the Governing Body.

Voluntary Controlled Schools, like Community Schools, Wakefield Council deals with their admissions.

Foundation Schools

'Trust Schools' are supported by a charitable foundation and the school(s) within the 'Trust' become foundation school(s). These schools have a degree of independence from the Local Authority. They own their own buildings and sites, employ their own staff and act as their own admissions authority.

Academies

Academies are similar to Foundation Schools, however they are funded directly by the Government and not the Council.

What if I want to apply for a Voluntary Aided School place?

To apply for these schools you still use the Wakefield application form or online application.

Wakefield Council will send a copy of your application onto them. It is the school's responsibility to check this against their admissions and oversubscription criteria.

Please note that for applications for places at a Voluntary Aided School you need to complete a supplementary information form. This allows the school's Governing Body to assess your application fully. You will need to contact the school direct and ask for this form. Please complete the form and return it to the school.

Wakefield Council will write to let you know whether your application has been agreed to, not the school.

Where can I find out more about junior or primary schools?

This guide includes information about all schools in Wakefield including names, addresses and telephone numbers. It also gives you:

- The maximum number of children each school can admit into reception year or year 3 (where appropriate)
- Details of how many children were admitted last year
- Any before or after school provision such as Breakfast Clubs, Childminders, After School Club, etc

Schools have their own prospectus. Contact the school for a copy.

General information about schools in Wakefield can be found on the Council's website, www.wakefield.gov.uk/schools. Here you can also find links to school websites.

When should I apply for a school place?

You must apply for your child's place by 15 January 2012.

If your child currently attends an infant school, Nursery or pre-5 setting and they live in the Wakefield district, an application pack will be made available to you there. If you have not received a pack please contact the Wakefield Admissions Team or use the online form at: www.wakefield.gov.uk/admissiontoschool

Don't forget the closing date for applications is 15 January 2012.

Is a first come, first served system used to allocate places?

No, we do not look at any applications until the closing date has passed. All places are allocated using the Published Admissions and Oversubscription Policy.

Where can I go for help and advice about which school to choose?

Deciding which schools to choose is a very important decision. The admissions process can be confusing. If you need any help or advice contact the Choice Advice Service.

This service is there to help you to understand all the different information and forms so that you can make the best choice of school for your child.

This could include:

- Listening to your questions and concerns
- Advice on all parts of the admissions process
- Help with completing the school admissions form
- Impartial information about schools within the Wakefield district and schools in neighbouring authorities, including school facilities, size, specialisms, curriculum, how well they are performing and Ofsted reports.
- Details of the admissions policies for different schools
- Explaining the options if you do not get the school you want
- Arranging school visits
- Information on school transport, travel and uniforms
- Advice and support if you want to appeal

The service will not make the decision for you. Neither will they recommend or guarantee a place at any school. They are there to help you to make that decision.

The support they provide is free and confidential. They will only share your information if you agree.

They are happy to meet you at home, school or in your local Children's Centre. You can also contact them by telephone or email.

Do I have the right to choose which school I want my child to attend?

As a parent/carer you have a legal right to express a preference for the schools you would like your child to attend. You do not have the right to decide the actual school. This is the decision of Wakefield Council Admissions Team or the Governing Body of the Voluntary Aided School or Foundation School. Each Community, Foundation or Voluntary Aided School serves a 'catchment' area.

You are much more likely to have your preference met if you ask for a school that serves your catchment area. To find out which catchment area you live in please contact Wakefield Council's School Admissions Team on 01924 305616/17 / 306766 or check the Council's website, **www.wakefield.gov.uk/admissiontoschool**

Some schools can receive more applications than number of places (the published admission number). If this happens, for community, foundation, voluntary controlled and academies (except Ossett*), school places will be allocated using Wakefield Council's over-subscription criteria and places will be offered in the following order:

- (a) Children in Public Care (Looked After Children);
- (b)
 - i Children who live in the school's catchment area, who have brothers or sisters at the same school, at the time of admission;
 - ii Other children who live in the school's catchment area;
 - iii Children who live in that part of the school's catchment area which is designated as an option area;
- (c) Children who have brothers or sisters in attendance at the school, a;
- (d) Other children, with priority being given to those living nearest to the school.

*Please note that that Ossett Academy has its own admissions policy. Details can be found under Section 8.

Please note:

- Any place offered on the basis of an address, which is later found to be fraudulent, may be withdrawn.
- The brother and sister category includes step-brothers and sisters. They must live at the same address, be of statutory school age and will still be at the same school, or a school on the same site, when the child starts.

- For oversubscribed schools, children living nearest to the school, (measured in a straight line from home to school) will be offered places first. Voluntary Aided Schools will use their own published over-subscription criteria. Contact the school for a copy of their criteria.

Please note that we cannot guarantee that you will be offered a place in any of your preferred or catchment area schools.

What if my child has a Statement of Special Educational Needs?

You still need to fill an application form in. Children with a Statement of Special Educational Needs are dealt with under a different system. Once we have received your application we will pass it onto the Special Educational Needs and Review Team. They will contact you to discuss your application. For further information please see the section on Special Educational Needs. The application process and closing date remains the same.

What if I am not happy with the school place I have been offered?

If you are unhappy with your offer and choose to refuse this, then you have a right of appeal.

You have twenty one days to do this from the date you receive your refusal letter.

You need to tell us the reasons for your appeal.

For your appeal to be successful you will need to prove that:

- the Council has not acted fairly in refusing your child a place at your preferred school or,
- there are exceptional circumstances why your child should attend your preferred school, even if the school is full.

For Community, Foundation, Voluntary Controlled or Catholic Voluntary Aided Schools, appeals should be sent to:

If your appeal is against another Council you need to get an appeals form from that Council. Some numbers are included in the Helpful Telephone Numbers in this guide.

If your child has a Statement of Special Educational Needs appeals are made to the Independent Special Educational Needs and Disability Tribunal. See the Special Educational Needs Section for more information.

What happens at appeal?

Your appeal will be heard by an independent appeal panel. You have the right to attend and to speak in the hearing. After the appeal you will receive a letter telling you of the panel's decision and the reasons for it. Any decision made by the appeals panel is binding and both schools and parents must keep to it.

Can I receive more than one offer?

No. Parents receive one and only one offer of a school place.

What if I have twins or triplets and only one gets a place?

If there is only one place available you will need to decide whether you take that place or not. You may wish to appeal for your other child(ren).

If my child does not get a place at a school of our choice is there a waiting list?

Yes. All children will remain on the waiting list until the end of the 2012/13 academic year.

Offers of places will be made as vacancies arise. Places will still be allocated using the Council's Over Subscription Criteria. We will write out to let you know once a place is available. Your position on the list can move up or down. You have 14 days to let us know whether you want the place or not.

If you do not let us know within this timescale the place will be offered to another child. At the end of each academic year all waiting lists for that academic year are closed. To stay on the list for the next school year you need to apply for the next academic year. Application forms are available from the School Admissions Team.

Your child will not be placed on a waiting list if they have a place at your first choice of school. If your child was offered a place at your second choice of school they will only go on the waiting list for your first choice of school.

If your child was offered a place at your third choice of school they will join the waiting lists for both your first and second choice.

If your child has not been offered a place at any of your chosen schools they will be placed on the waiting list for all three schools you selected.

What if I make a late application?

The closing date for all applications is 15 January 2012. Any applications or amended applications received after the 17 February 2012, (unless there is a change of address) will be considered as late applications. These will not be processed until all those who applied on time have been dealt with.

What if my child's address changes or we move house?

Moving house or a change of address may affect your offer of a school place.

Please let us know straight away. You will need to provide proof of your new address or the reasons for the change to your child's address.

- If you submit an on-time application and notify us of a change of address before 17 February 2012, we will implement the new address and this will be treated as an on-time application.
- If you submit an on-time application and notify us of a change of address after 17 February 2012, we will implement the new address and this will be treated as a late application.
- If you submit an on-time application and notify us of a change of preference and change of address after 17 February 2012, this will be treated as a late application.

Fraudulent Applications

Any school place offered on a fraudulent address will be withdrawn. You may be asked for proof of address. This may be:

- A letter from your Solicitors detailing any house purchase and the completion date. A letter of intention to purchase is not enough.
- Evidence (e.g. from an Estate Agent or Solicitor) of a tenancy agreement or lease, including the start and end date.
- Appropriate written evidence (in the form of a letter from your Solicitor or Estate Agent) confirming the sale of your property or termination of a tenancy agreement/ lease.
- If you are returning to live in a property that you already own. We will need written evidence of the date that you are returning and that you plan to stay there.
- If you have been renting your property out evidence that you have given your tenants notice to leave.

- If the move is to live with a member of your family or to live with you, we will need to see proof of child benefit, showing that the child is at that address.

Please note that if the proof you give is not to the satisfaction of the Wakefield Council School Admissions Team your amended application will not be considered.

In some cases an Education Welfare Officer may visit you to check that your child lives at the address you put on your application form.



Section 4

Special Educational Needs

Special Educational Needs (SEN) is a term used when a child needs specialist support at school to help them with their educational learning.

This may be due to:

- A learning disability
- An emotional, behavioural, sensory or physical disability
- Difficulty with communication or speech and language

Some children may have more complex needs. This may mean that they need to go to a school that offers specialist provision or resources to better meet their needs.

The Council has a number of services to help support parents and children with special educational needs. We are committed to meeting the needs of all children, wherever possible, within mainstream schools or in special schools or resourced provision.

Places in schools within other Councils will only be considered in very exceptional circumstances.

This section explains the admissions process for children who have special educational needs including some frequently asked questions.



What help is available if my child has special needs?

Most children with special educational needs go to mainstream schools within their local community. Schools have resources to help support the learning needs of most children.

The Council also provides services to parents and schools such as:

- The Special Educational Needs Support Services (SENSS)
- Service for Social Communication and Interaction (SSCI)
- Educational Psychology Service (EPS)
- Educational Welfare Service (EWS)
- Parent Partnership Service (PPS)

Some children with more complex needs may have a 'Statement of Special Educational Needs'. This is a formal document about the educational needs of your child. This is put together with yourself, your child and other professionals who may be involved with your child.

Do all children with special educational needs have a statement?

No. The majority of children do not need a statement.

Some children may already have a statement before they start school.

If your child does not have a statement you apply in the same way as for all other children. You need to fill the application form in and send it back. Make sure you tick the box to tell us your child has a special educational need.

How do I apply if my child has a Statement of Special Educational Needs?

If your child has a statement, the Council's Special Needs Team will discuss the most appropriate schools with you. They can advise you whether the school you have chosen is suitable for your child's needs.

You can choose a mainstream school. The school you choose must be able to support your child's learning needs.

The Council has to name the school you ask for unless:

- The school cannot meet your child's needs
- Your child's attendance will affect the education of other children
- There are no places available

Like everyone else you still need to fill in and return an application form. Your application will be sent on to the special educational needs Assessment and Review Team. You can do this online or in paper format.

If the school you wish to choose is a Voluntary Aided, Foundation School or Academy, the School Governing Body (not the Council) decides who gets places. These schools have their own agreed admissions criteria. See Section 8 for a summary of these. Contact the school to find out more.

Within Wakefield there is a wide range of schools that can offer specialist support. You can find the details of these in Appendix 2.

What if my child needs to attend a special school?

Some children are unable to be supported in mainstream schools. They will need to go to a special school or resourced provision. Here children will have specialist teaching staff and resources to help them with their education. Special resourced provisions are often within mainstream schools.

The options for your child will be discussed at the review of the statement.

Filling the application form in.

When filling the form in please don't forget to tick the box to let us know that your child has a Statement of Special Educational Needs.

Will transport be available to school?

This will depend on your child's needs and the distance from your child's home to school. See Section 6 on Home to School Transport. Again this will be discussed with you before your child starts school.

If I do not agree with the naming of a school on my child's statement, can I appeal and where would I go to do this?

Yes you can. However the first thing you should do is speak to your child's special educational needs officer and let them know that you are unhappy with the named school. You may be able to sort this between you.

If you are still unhappy, the Parent Partnership Service may be able to help. They offer impartial advice and guidance to parents and carers of children who have Special Educational Needs. They are there to help with all issues that may affect your child including admission to schools, school placements and the Council's special needs procedures.

Their aim is to work with you and the Council to try to find a solution. They will also explain what you need to do if you want to make an appeal. Appeals are dealt with by the Special Educational Needs and Disability Tribunal (SENDIST).

Please don't hesitate to contact them they will be only too happy to help. You can telephone them or they can visit you at home.

For children who do not have a Statement of Special Needs the appeals process is the same as for mainstream schools.

Who else can I talk to about my child's needs?

If you need more information you can also talk to staff at your child's current or new school. You can also talk to the Council's Special Educational Needs Assessment and Review Team. You can contact them on 01924 302465. Don't forget that the Parent Partnership Service or Choice Advice Service can also help.

Section 5

Changing School - Transfers and Mid-Year Applications

This section explains how we deal with transfers and mid-year applications.

A mid-year application normally happens when your child moves house. Sometimes it can be because your child is having difficulties at school and you would like to move them to another.

All mid-year applications (including those for schools in other Council areas) **MUST** be made on a Wakefield admissions form. You can get these from Wakefield Council's School Admissions Team.

You can choose up to three schools. Your application will still be checked against the approved admissions criteria for those schools.

If the schools you choose are full and you live in the Wakefield district you will be offered a place at the closest community school to you that have places available. We will also tell you about the appeal process if you are unhappy with this offer.

Before you stop your child from going to their current school please check that the schools you would like to choose have places available.

If your child is having problems at school, please tell the Headteacher immediately, they may be able to sort this out. The Education Welfare Service may also be able to help, see Section 7. You can contact them on: 01924 307451

Please note that Wakefield has agreed an 'In Year Fair Access Protocol'.

This means that some applications to move school may be given a higher priority than other pupils on the waiting list. You can get a copy of the protocol from the School Admission Team or from the Council's website, **www.wakefield.gov.uk/admissiontoschool**

Section 6

Home to School Transport

Transport legislation does not recognise catchment areas as part of the assessment criteria for the entitlement of free school transport. Only the nearest qualifying school can be considered for transport purposes and this school may not be the catchment area school.

Qualifying schools include community, foundation, voluntary schools or academies.

To qualify for help with home to school transport one of the following rules must be satisfied:

- 1. Children aged 5 – 8** attending the nearest qualifying school, with places available, and the distance between home and school must exceed 2 miles*. The 2 mile limit only applies up to the end of the term in which the child becomes 8 – after that a 3 mile limit applies;
- 2. Children aged 8-11** attending the nearest qualifying school, with places available and the distance between home and school must exceed 3 miles*;
- 3. Children aged 5 – 11** baptised into the faith and attending the nearest qualifying denominational school subject to the above qualifying distances; or
- 4. Children aged 8 - 11** from low-income families who live more than 2 miles from their nearest qualifying school (these children are entitled to receive free school meals or parents receive the maximum level of Working Tax Credit).

The LA will also “have regard to”, amongst other things, any wish of a parent for their child to be educated at the nearest qualifying school on the grounds of parents religion or belief subject to the above qualifying distance criteria. If you are applying for transport on the grounds of parents religion or belief you must provide clear written supporting evidence to demonstrate the basis on which the choice of school has been made.

In cases where parents are opposed to their children attending a faith school for reasons of non-belief and where the nearest qualifying school is a faith school, free travel will be provided to the next nearest qualifying non-faith school subject to the above qualifying distance criteria.

Following a change in legislation governing the entitlement to free school transport for low income groups, it became apparent that a number of applications did not meet the qualifying distance criteria.

Given the immediate potential impact on families it was agreed to introduce a “phasing out” period. This means that where pupils have been issued with a free bus pass and it is found their child had not been attending the nearest qualifying school, that pupil would continue to receive free travel until they left school at 16.

However, any younger sibling or new applicant for free travel would be assessed strictly in line with the home to school transport policy and unless the pupil was attending the nearest qualifying school (with places available) subject to the distance criteria free travel would not be provided.

This also applies to new applicants who may have had a sibling, who previously attended the school but left prior to their younger sibling applying for free travel.

If a pupil has been issued with a free bus pass under the above “phasing out” rule but the pupil then moves address or school mid-year the application will be treated as a new application.

Where parents feel there are very good reasons as to why an exception to the home to school transport policy should be made there is an appeals process

**The 2 and 3 mile distance is measured as the nearest available walking route along which a child, accompanied as necessary, may walk with reasonable safety. This route can include footpaths, bridleways and other pathways as well as recognised roads.*

Section 7

General Information

You have a legal duty to make sure that your child is educated. It is your responsibility to make sure that your child attends school. If your child is not at school you may be contacted to find out why. If your child is ill and not able to go to school you need to let the school know straight away.

Holidays during school time

Family holidays and days out should be taken during school holidays. Only in exceptional circumstances will holidays or days off in school time be allowed. You will need to get the Headteacher and/or Chair of Governors agreement to this first.

Education Welfare Service

The Education Welfare Service is there to help parents and children if they are having problems at school or home.

- They check up on non attendance at school and may telephone or visit you and your child to find out why they are not in school
- They can offer advice and support on a number of things; such as, exclusions, bullying, attendance, truancy, drug abuse, bereavement and a wide range of other home and/or school difficulties

You can contact them either through school or on telephone numbers 01924 307451 or 01924 307413.

Children who take part in performance or modelling.

Children may take part in a 'licensed performance'. Again you need to notify the Council and apply for a licence. The Council decides whether to approve your application or not. This is to make sure that your child is working in a safe environment for them. For further information and advice with regard to any of these please contact the Education Welfare Service Child Employment Officer on 01924 307449. More information is available on the Council's website: www.wakefield.gov.uk.

Sporting events

Children and Young People enjoy taking part in sport. Sport enhances health and well-being and builds confidence. Most children and young people take part in sport as a hobby in their own time, however, some children excel in their chosen sport and may then be selected to participate

- in regional or national events. Sports events whereby a child or young person is paid to participate or that require absence from school are regulated by national legislation. (The Children Protection at Work Regulations 1998) they will need a Sports Licence to partake in the activity. Licences can be obtained from the Education Welfare Service.

Free School Meals

- Your child/children can have free school meals if you receive;

- Income support; or
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance (JSAIB); or
- Child Tax Credit without Working Tax Credit and your annual income is less than £16190 (as assessed by the Inland Revenue as at 5 April 2011), or
- Guarantee element of State Pension Credit, or
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999; or
- Employment Support Allowance (income related)

- Your child must be in school full time to receive free school meals.

- Children who go to Nursery Schools, Independent Schools or post 16 Colleges are not entitled to free school meals.

Applying for Free School Meals

- You need to fill an application form in each year. You can get a form from school or the Council's Free School Meals Team and once you have filled this in you need to send your form back with proof of your benefit or income to:

- If it is your first application for free school meals you will not need to send proof of your benefits (unless we ask you to do so). We check this with the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) , Home Office or HMRC (Revenues and Customs)

For renewing free school meals applications we will need to see the following:

- If you receive Child Tax Credit, you must send your most recent Tax Credit Award Notice and proof of your income;
- If you receive the 'Guaranteed' element of State Pension Credit, we may need your 'Pension Credit M100' award notice.

We will write out to you to let you know whether your application has been approved or not. We will also write to the school to let them know.

- Your child will normally start having free school meals from the date we receive your application form. Unless you can prove to us that there are exceptional circumstances to your case, we will not backdate your child's entitlement. You will have to make your request in writing. Make sure you get your form back to us quickly.
- Free school meals are given for twelve months. You will need to re-apply each year. If at any time your situation changes you must tell us immediately.
- In order to process claims more quickly, we have three separate times for parents to re-apply. This depends on your surname:

Surnames A - F Easter to Easter
Surnames G - O September to July
Surnames P - Z January to December

We will send you a form towards the end of the twelve months. If you still want free school meals you must fill this in and return to us or the meals will stop.

If things change

You must tell us straight away. It is illegal for your child to have free school meals if you do not qualify and will be asked to repay the cost of meals taken while you were not entitled to free school meals.

School trips

If your child has free school meals, the school should provide your child with a packed lunch.

Families Information Service (FIS)

They provide free detailed, accurate, up to date information on a wide range of local services and support for parents of children and young people up to 20 years old.

They can provide information, guidance and advice on:

- Parenting
- Family learning
- Financial support for families including Working Tax Credits
- Childcare
- Services and support for disabled children and young people
- Physical and mental health,
- Sports, play and recreational opportunities,
- Activities and support for young people and much more.

They also work with organisations and professionals who support children, young people and their families.

The Choice Advice Service and Parent Partnership Service are also based with the Families Information Service.

Admissions Policies for Voluntary Aided Schools, Catholic Schools and Ossett Academy

Please see below the admissions criteria for Wakefield's Voluntary Aided Schools.

All Saints Featherstone, C of E (VA) Junior, Infant and Nursery School

Oversubscription Criteria

Where the number of applications for All Saints School received during the normal admissions round exceeds the admission number of the school the Governing Body will apply the following criteria in strict order of priority

1. Looked After Children (A child who is looked after by the Local Authority in accordance with Section 22 of the Children Act 1989).
2. A child who, or whose parents/guardians, resides within the parish of All Saints, or whose parents/guardians are on the electoral roll of that church, and who are:
 - a) **'At the heart of the church'**
A regular worshipper. A person who worships at least twice per month. The worshipper could be one or both parents or the child.
 - b) **'Attached to the church'**
A regular but not frequent worshipper. A person who usually attends a monthly family or church parade service or is regularly involved in a weekday church activity including an element of worship.

A 'Supplementary Information Form' (SIF) to provide confirmation of Christian commitment is available from the school. The form should be signed by the Vicar, Rector, Priest in Charge, etc. During an interregnum the form should be signed by a Churchwarden.

Parents having moved to become resident in the parish(es) mentioned above, having been on the Electoral Roll of another Anglican parish, will qualify upon proof of membership being provided by the priest of that other parish.

- . A child who has a brother or sister (including a half-, step- or adoptive brother or sister) attending the school at the proposed date of admission.
 4. A child whose parents/guardians reside within the parish of All Saints who are members of another Christian Church recognised by Churches Together in England and Wales whose Church is within the parish, who are:
 - a) **'At the heart of the church'**
A regular worshipper. A person who worships at least twice per month. The worshipper could be one or both parents.
 - b) **'Attached to the church'**
A regular but not frequent worshipper. A person who usually attends a monthly family or church parade service or is regularly involved in a weekday church activity including an element of worship.
- A 'Supplementary Information Form' (SIF) to provide confirmation of Christian commitment is available from the school. The form should be signed by the Minister of Religion.
- Parents having moved to become resident in the parish(es) mentioned above, having been Members of another Christian Church recognised by Churches Together in England and Wales, will qualify upon proof of membership being provided by the Minister of that other Church.
5. A child of parents residing within the 'Admissions Priority Area'.
 6. Other children.

Holy Trinity CE (VA) Primary School

Oversubscription Criteria

All children who apply for a place at the school will be offered a place if places are available. In the event that there are more applications for places than the number of places available, places will be offered according to the following criteria:

1. Looked After Children.
2. a) Children who have siblings in the school on the date of admission, who live within the area served by the school and whose parents have a Church commitment who are 'At the heart of the church' (ie a regular worshipper – twice a month).
- b) Children who have siblings in the school on the date of admission, who live within the area served by the school and whose parents have a Church commitment who are 'Attached to the church' (ie a regular but not frequent worshipper).

(A SIF form to provide confirmation of Christian commitment should be filled in and is available from the school. The form should be signed by the Vicar, Rector or other minister and returned to the school.)

3. Children who have siblings in the school on the date of admission who live in the area served by the school.
4. Children who have siblings in the school on the date of admission whose parents have a Church commitment.
5. Children who have siblings in the school on the date of admission.
6. Children who live within the area served by the school whose parents have a Church commitment.
7. Children who live in the area served by the school.
8. Children whose parents have a Church commitment.
9. Children who are attending Holy Trinity School nursery immediately prior to date of admission.

Normanton All Saints CE (VA) Infant School

Oversubscription criteria

If the number of applicants exceed the admissions limit then the following oversubscription criteria will be used in order of priority:-

1. 'Looked After Children' defined as children who are in the care of a Local Authority (in accordance with Section 22 of the Children Act 1989).
2. Children whose parents or guardians are regular and frequent worshipping members of Normanton Parish Church and whose names are entered on the roll of Church membership.
3. Children whose parents or guardians are regular and frequent worshipping members of another Anglican Church, and whose names are entered on that Church's roll of membership.
4. Children whose parents or guardians are regular and frequent worshipping members of another Christian Church, and whose names are entered on the roll of membership of that Church.

(Please note that to be considered under any of categories 2, 3, or 4, a letter of support is required from your Vicar or Minister. Please also note that a Christian Church is one holding a Trinitarian doctrine of faith.)

5. Children with brothers or sisters attending Main School at the proposed date of admission to Main School.
6. Children resident within the Admissions Priority Area of the school.
(Details of the Admissions Priority Area are available at the School)
7. Children resident within the Parish of All Saints, Normanton.
8. Children resident outside the Parish.

That for the above criteria, '**resident**' refers to the child's permanent home at the proposed date of admission. Further that where the above criteria are not adequate to distinguish between requests for admission within each category, those living nearest will be given priority. The method of measurement used will be the **radial distance** rather than walking distance between the child's permanent home and the school main gate.

Sandal Endowed CE (VA) Junior School

Oversubscription Criteria

Where the number of applications for Sandal Endowed CE VA Junior School received during the normal admissions round exceeds the admission number of the school the Governing Body will apply the following criteria in strict order of priority.

1. Looked After Children (A child who is looked after by the Local Authority in accordance with Section 22 of the Children Act 1989).
 2. A child who, or whose parents/guardians, resides within the ancient parish of Sandal Magna (ie parishes of Sandal magna with Newmillerdam; Chapelthorpe, St James; and Sandal St Catherine's) or whose parents/guardians are on the electoral roll of that church, and who are:
 - a) **'At the heart of the church'**
A regular worshipper. A person who worships at least twice per month. The worshipper could be one or both parents or the child.
 - b) **'Attached to the church'**
A regular but not frequent worshipper. A person who usually attends a monthly family or church parade service or is regularly involved in a weekday church activity including an element of worship.
- A 'Supplementary Information Form' (SIF) to provide confirmation of Christian commitment is available from the school. The form should be signed by the Vicar, Rector, Priest in Charge, etc. During an interregnum the form should be signed by a Churchwarden.
- Parents having moved to become resident in the parish(es) mentioned above, having been on the Electoral Roll of another Anglican parish, will qualify upon proof of membership being provided by the priest of that other parish.
3. A child who has a brother or sister (including a half-, step- or adoptive brother or sister) attending the school at the proposed date of admission.
 4. A child whose parents/guardians reside within the ancient parish of Sandal Magna and who are members of another Christian Church recognised by Churches Together in England and Wales whose Church is within the parish, who are:

- a) **'At the heart of the church'**
A regular worshipper. A person who worships at least twice per month. The worshipper could be one or both parents.
- b) **'Attached to the church'**
A regular but not frequent worshipper. A person who usually attends a monthly family or church parade service or is regularly involved in a weekday church activity including an element of worship.
- A 'Supplementary Information Form' (SIF) to provide confirmation of Christian commitment is available from the school. The form should be signed by the Minister of Religion.
