Who is it for?

Anyone aged 19+, you may be entitled to a free course or financial help with childcare, equipment, or fees. Unless you are already employed as a teaching assistant, you must have the Level 2 Certificate in Supporting Teaching & Learning in Schools before starting this higher level course. You will need to have an informal interview to assess your suitability for the course.

Where and when will it take place?

Courses start throughout the year at various locations across the Wakefield District.

What do I need to bring with me?

Pen and notebook

Materials as directed in additional information

Important Information about your Course:

- You are expected to attend every week/session
- If not employed you will be required to find a voluntary work placement within an appropriate school setting for 10 hours per week throughout the duration of the course. The placement must be able to provide a range of opportunities to support the level 3 standards.
- The course fee includes a course text book.
- You will be required to meet the requirements of an enhanced DBS.
- Assessment will be via assignments, case studies, observations of work practice, expert witness testimonies, and professional discussions.
